



DMO Training Sample Readings

Sample 1: Adult Male

The patient is a 64-year-old male who presents with chest pain. He reports that it started 2 days ago. He describes it as sharp, midsternal pain, radiating to his right arm and shoulder. He complains of associated shortness of breath, cold sweats, and nausea. He denies vomiting, rectal bleeding, or tarry stools. He denies any history of heart attacks. He does have a history of COPD, CAD, hypertension, and hyperlipidemia.

Scratch that sample:

The patient presented to the ED (pause) complaining of chest pain. (replace after pause with complaining of headache)

Correction sample:

The patient was referred to Dr Karasmanis (Patient was started on rosuvastatin)

Sample 2: Pysch Eval

The patient was evaluated by the psychiatric liaison who feels at this time the patient does not meet the criteria for psychiatric admission. The patient denies suicidal or homicidal ideation and will contract for safety. They have been provided with additional information about resources for further treatment and discharged.

Sample 3: Radiation Discussion

A discussion was held with the patient's mother regarding the risks and benefits of repeat radiation. Considering that the patient has had [several] CT scans in the past [month] and that there was no clinical evidence of acute appendicitis, the mother has decided to decline a CT/pelvis.

Sample 4: Physical Exam (showing variables with normal values)

GENERAL: [The patient is well-developed, well-nourished and in no acute distress. The patient is alert and oriented x 3 and lying comfortably on the bed.]

HEENT: [Atraumatic, normocephalic. The pupils are equal, round, and reactive. Extraocular movements are intact.]

NECK: [Supple with full range of motion. No rigidity or meningismus.]

LUNGS: [Clear to auscultation.]

HEART: [Regular rate and rhythm. No murmur, S3, or S4.]

ABDOMEN: [Soft, nondistended, nontender with active bowel sounds.]

EXTREMITIES: [Unremarkable.]

NEUROLOGIC: [Unremarkable.]
