

#### Overview

Ambulatory widgets are categories of data that are displayed on the Summary tab or in the Reference Region on a patient's chart. Widgets are comprised of both standard widgets and specialty widgets. MEDITECH contains 100's of standard widgets which are system based (or hard coded) and can be managed within the chart by adding or removing them from the Summary tab or reference region. Information available within widgets include contents such as lab items, report items, queries, or notes for a provider specialty.


The utilization of Widgets, the My Widget and Patient Widget are recommended to aid in finding data within the patient chart. These are customizable for providers to include information most pertinent to their specialty and/or patients. Both the My Widget and Patient Widget are user specific. These widgets can include labs, radiology reports, document reports, and queries. The reports op1on does not include scanned reports.





To manage widgets on the Summary Tab and Reference Region select the cogwheel on the Summary Tab




Once in the widget preferences, search for a widget or widgets to add to the summary tab. Note: The system will not display the search field if the number of widgets have exceeded the number allowed for it.




Use the arrows on the header and on the chosen widget title to move it side to side or up and down.

After moving the widget to the location of choice select the "Save" button.



### How to add to "My Widget"

Using the My Widget feature, right-click a lab test, report, or query on the Summary tab to display and add that item to the My Widget. For this example, the document Asthma Visit report is used. Once the document is selected using a right-click, the current "My Widget" options display in the overlay.



Once the document is selected for the My Widget, the overlay closes. The document, with the most current date it was recorded, automatically displays in the Reference Region within the My Widget accordion.
