New Patient Disposition: “Left Before Registration”

Overview:

If patients are received and/or triage but leave before registration, you now have the disposition called “Left Before Registration”

This status will not require a physician to put a discharge order.

Registration will register the patient.

Nurse will depart using “Left Before Registration”.
