SUR Discharge

Once your patient has met discharge criteria, and is prepared to go home you can use the **Discharge Intervention** as seen below in PHASE2 SOC.

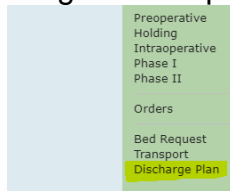
If You Have Respiratory Symptoms: Rest and Relax

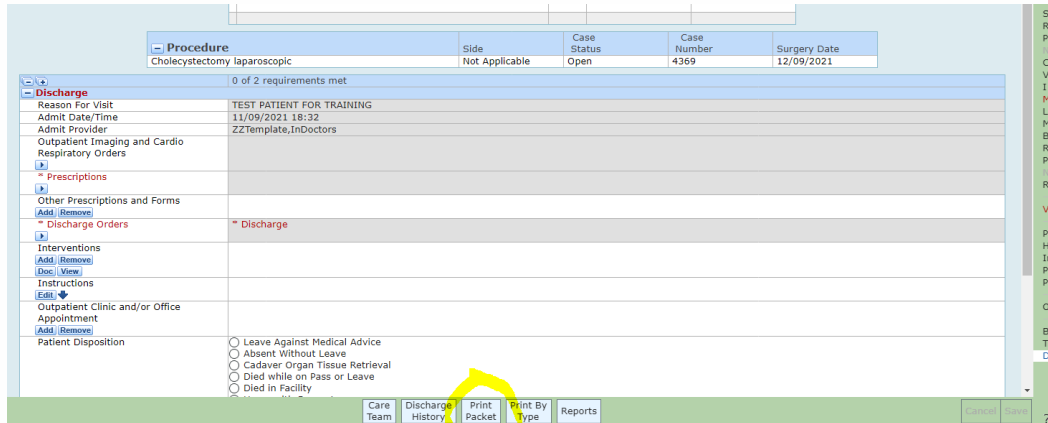
Discharge orders will be seen in the **ORDERS** section, as well you will notice there is a discharge order, when it appears on the tracker.

You will use the Print Package footer button to print surgeon’s instructions for patient to take home.



Surgeons may print prescriptions and place in chart, or surgeons may bring prescription to bedside when they see the patient prior to discharge.
